#### Background for the kick-off meeting (Ispra, 1991)

- > There was (and still is) a great number of regulatory models in use within Europe.
- Generally, the models applied were not scientifically up-todate.
- > There was a lack of common standards and tools.





#### Harmonisation?

- > It was never the idea to achieve complete harmonisation in the sense that one model is appointed as 'the one and only'.
- Instead: Many tools, procedures and datasets should be harmonised in order to avoid unnecessary duplication of effort.
- > A central issue: How can we pool experiences and encourage re-use of our work?
- > One of the roles of the initiative: Help establish mechanisms for this.

#### Another central issue at the conference

> Work to ensure that model results are trustworthy



#### Focus on aspects such as

- > ensuring that models are scientifically sound

- > guidance to ensure proper use of models
- > promotion of good practices and elimination of bad
- > quality assurance with respect to model development
- > establishment of reference problems
- > ensuring proper exchange of experiences.
